- * General education pre-requisite courses for applicants with a previous baccalaureate degree.
- a. All general education pre-requisite course grades must be a "C" or better. A cumulative grade point average of 2.50 or greater is also required.
- b. Anatomy & Physiology must include the entire body system; may require more than six (6) hours.
- c. Prefer to include growth through the life-span. Will accept infancy through adolescence.
- d. The Advanced Composition requirement can be met in one of the following ways: (1) by achieving a grade of "A" or "B" in English Composition I, and a grade of "A" in English Composition II; (2) by providing proof of credit earned by CLEP or departmental exams in English for both Compositions I & II (must appear on college transcript).
- e. College Algebra or its equivalent is required by Arkansas State Law.
